Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Recently brother Jared shared a book with me entitled *Before You Hit the Wall* by Danny Lehmann that he is using to prepare for a class he will be teaching on Oahu for Youth with a Mission (YWAM). About in the middle of the book I came across the thought, "The true power of God comes when we get down on our knees in prayer before God. . ."

This really struck me as the Christian talking points in the media of late have been about "Christian Nationalism" or as the German theologian Dorothee Soelle called it first, "Christo-Fascism." This is the idea of Christianity projecting secular or political power. I recall Mahatma Gandhi's statement while facing the army of the British Empire, "The only real power in the universe is spiritual."

In this time of Lent leading up to Easter, I am especially reminded that Jesus defeated all earthly powers by surrendering his body to the Cross and his Spirit to God. In this surrender we acknowledge the total defeat of the Roman Empire, the Kingdom of Herod, and our own hearts. The life of one man, Jesus, has overcome the world.

Now, I am a *Mayflower* descendant through the Alden line. I understand that colonial America was founded by Separatist Christians seeking to "separate" themselves from the earthly authorities of the Papacy and the Archbishop of the Church of England who served at the pleasure of the King—who was the self-proclaimed head of the Church of England. Thusly the very founding of the country we know and love as America was in opposition to the comingling of government and Christian Faith.

Who was the priest or pastor that came with the Pilgrims? Oh yeah, there was no one. They enjoyed the priesthood of all believers and held that the only authority was Jesus as represented in Holy Scripture. When decisions needed to be made, they voted as a congregation. Pastors could be hired, but they were to be the servants of the congregation only. Jesus was and is today still the absolute Head of His Church.

In recognition that Jesus never built a church building, the congregationalists met in "meetinghouses" with no cross on the top that could be seen as an idol (symbol of earthly power). That is why our church has no cross on it. The missionaries who came over two hundred years ago believed this.


