Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When the first missionaries Samuel Whitney and Samuel Ruggles were brought before King Kaumualii in 1820, Kauai was still an independent Kingdom fending off attempts by King Kamehameha to conquer the isle. The missionaries were very young, just out of college. They bowed and then knelt before King Kaumualii to explain their faith to him and their desire to minister to the people in Waimea. The response from the great king was to simply ask: "Will you stay?" As it was, ships and crews had come and gone from Waimea Bay, but very few had stayed for any length of time. The king knew that his people could only benefit if the missionaries stayed. When the missionaries promised that they would stay in the kingdom to help the people, King Kaumualii prepared a great feast for them and offered to build them a house to stay in.

How important it is to stay. I have always said that the first rule of ministry is to "be there." That is why Jesus came in human form down to earth—so that God could "be there" with us. That is why we call Jesus "Emmanuel," or "God with us. "Staying with people means showing up to the hospital emergency room in times of need, sharing joyous occasions such as weddings and baptisms, and making time in one's schedule for personal spiritual counseling. Staying means being at the chancel of the church every Sunday, mopping floors on Mondays, and being woven into the warp and weft of others' lives.

A few months ago, at the Middle School Bible Club, the current student president, Bryanna, came up to me and showed me a picture of her mother and father being married. "There you are!" she exclaimed while pointing to a much younger me as the officiant. She then went on to state that I had baptized her as a child. Bryanna's mother is Anna, the granddaughter of former member Anna Kona.

I gazed at the picture and replied, "That is right. I knew you even before you were born and were just a twinkle in your mother's eye. And I held you as a baby in my arms to baptize you." She smiled broadly and gave me a hug.

This is not an isolated incident in so far as I have re-met many grown children whom I have held in my arms to baptize, have taken to Waineke youth camp, or had to chastise at the afterschool open gym. There is one young woman at the hardware store who always recounts how I saved her life when she and some other youth had gotten lost in the forests of Kokee during a youth retreat.



August's selection is *Everything is Tuberculosis: The History and Persistance of Our Deadliest Infection* by John Green.

Jackie Matsumura will host on August 17, 2025. Tuberculosis is one of the oldest diseases to infect people. There has been a cure for TB for decades, yet it still is deadly to many. It is one of the leading causes of death from an infectious disease. Green tells the story of one African young man illustrating the failure of governments to unify to eradicate this disease. Instead, it has evolved to be deadlier. Green's book tells how this disease created towns in the west and influenced writers and fashion.
