Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Suddenly the drought is riven. The petrachor is wafting around my head. The dry hardpacked soil crumbles dark then muds underfoot. The long-forgotten seed awakens and sprouts. Kauai recreates verdant once more. Tall blades of ruffling clumpgrass flash in the sun as the afternoon breeze cools. A one-quarter rainbow holding up a dark cloud in the morning greets the colors of blossoming purple ruellia.

I cannot recall ever experiencing a longer drought on this island. We had been watering only some trees in the hope to keep their roots alive. Not all the trees survived. Some still need critical care. We had to put off planting the Fall vegetables. I turned the soil just after the first paltry downpour, but finding four inches of moisture somehow. I was so thankful for just enough.

We just finished our sermon series on "Saint Paul's Summer Vacation." When I think back on Paul's days in ministry and all that he went through, I see that he somehow always had just enough to get through. Even when he went to the Church in Corinth and was forced to take up tentmaking in order to eat because the church would not support him, he had enough to minister as the Lord needed. Later he wrote the church in Corinth these words (2 Cor. 9:8) "God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work."

The very faith lesson of Jesus at the Feeding of the Five Thousand (MT 14) is that there is always just enough, no matter how little you have, and that God will give some leftovers as a sign of heavenly grace as well. I will always think how wonderful it is that someone left those three leaves of lettuce from the dinner the night before in the fridge just for me!

I know that we are all supposed to focus on how God provides for us abundantly. Just maybe the concept of "abundance" has become exaggerated by credit card companies and retailers. Having just enough is really the promise God gives us. When Adam and Eve fled Eden, God provided clothes for them in their newly experienced shame—not a weekly wardrobe, just enough skins to cover their own skin. God will cover you. Whatever the need.
